

Day 01 : Mumbai – Cappadocia (Lunch, Dinner)

Depart from Mumbai airport and take a flight to Cappadocia via Istanbul. Arrive and have a scrumptious lunch prepared by our own Rajasthani Maharaj.

Cappadocia: There would be very few places you've ever visited that strike you with their magic as much as Turkey's Cappadocia does. In fact, Cappadocia, a region with an unrealistic desert-like landscape, is one of the most magical places you've ever been to. The natural scenery of Cappadocia looks like something out of a Dr Seuss book, complete with the so-called Fairy Chimneys, limestone structures that have been carved by nature into the most interesting shapes.

To add to the mystique, humans have transformed the scenery over centuries in the most unusual way: by carving houses, churches, and even an entire castle, into the inside of these fairy chimneys. In some instances, the man-made caves are complemented by additional brick and mortar structures, while in others, the only hints that someone has taken over the fairy chimney are the small windows carved from the inside out to bring in the light.

This evening we shall enjoy a 3D Zelve Mapping Show. It will enthrall your visit to this Mystical Land and enjoy the laser lights as they give a colourful array of visuals setting the tone of your visit in Turkey.

Day 02: Cappadocia (Breakfast, Lunch & Dinner)

Wake up early in the morning and head out for the most amazing experience that Turkey has to offer the Hot Air Balloon.

After breakfast, full day excursion in Cappadocia including visits to Underground City, entails views of the Fairy chimneys at the Deverent Valley the Pigeon Valley and a photo stop at Uchisar castle.

After lunch enjoy quad bike adventure in Cap-

padocia. Later this evening have early lunch and enjoy the Belly Dance show in Cappadocia.

Belly dance is primarily a torso-driven dance, with an emphasis on articulations of the hips. Although some of these isolations appear similar to the isolations used in jazz ballet, they are sometimes driven differently and have a different feeling or emphasis.



Day 03: Cappadocia - Konya -
Antalya (Breakfast, Lunch &
Dinner)

Early breakfast and drive to Antalya
via Konya

Once we arrive in Konya we shall visit
the famous mouseleum of the sufi phi-
losopher Mevlana. The Mevlana Mu-
seum (MevlanaMüzesi), also known
as the Green Mausoleum or Green
Dome, is the original lodge of the
Mevlevi Whirling Dervishes, a mys-
tical Sufi Muslim group. It contains
the tomb and shrine of the Mevlana,
or Rumi, which remains an important
place of pilgrimage.

Post visit we shall have a lunch and
then drive to Antalya.



Antalya is a Turkish resort city with a
yacht-filled Old Harbour and beaches
flanked by large hotels. It's a gateway
to Turkey's southern Mediterranean
region, known
as the Turquoise Coast for its blue wa-
ters. Remnants remain from Antalya's
time as a major Roman port. These
include Hadrian's Gate, built to honour
the Roman
emperor's visit in 130 A.D and
2nd-century Hidirlik Tower, with har-
bour views.

Day 05: Antalya - Pamukkale (Breakfast, Lunch & Dinner)


After breakfast, checkout of the hotel and depart for Pamukkale. Depart to visit the Heriapolis, Necropolis and “Cotton castle”

The ancient Greco-Roman city of Hierapolis was built on top of the white “castle” which is in total about 2,700 metres (8,860 ft) long, 600 m (1,970 ft) wide and 160 m (525 ft) high. It can be seen from the hills on the opposite side of the valley in the town of Denizli, 20 km away. Tourism is and has been a major industry. People have bathed in its pools for thousands of years. As recently as the mid-20th century, hotels were built over the ruins of Hierapolis, causing considerable

damage. An approach road was built from the valley over the terraces, and motor bikes were allowed to go up and down the slopes. When the area was declared a World Heritage Site, the hotels were demolished and the road removed and replaced with artificial pools. Wearing shoes in the water is prohibited to protect the deposits. Then we shall continue our journey to Pamukkale - meaning “cotton castle” in Turkish, is a natural site in Denizli Province in southwestern Turkey. The city contains hot springs and travertines, terraces of carbonate minerals left by the flowing water. It is located in Turkey’s Inner Aegean region, in the River Menderes valley, which has a temperate climate for most of the year.

Overnight at Pamukkale.





Day 6: Pamukkale – Sirince
-Kusadasi (Breakfast, Lunch,
Dinner)

After breakfast depart for Kusadasi:
Kuşadasi is a resort town on Turkey's
Aegean coast, and the centre of the
seaside district of the same name with-
in Aydın Province.

The area has been a centre of art and
culture since some of the earliest re-
corded history, and has been settled by
many civilizations since being found-
ed by the Leleges people in 3000 BC.
Later settlers include the Aeolians in
the 11th century BC and Ionians in
the 9th. Originally, seamen and trad-
ers built a number of settlements along
the coastline, including Neopolis.
Prior to arrival into Kusadasi we shall
be visiting Sirince Village Known
throughout Turkey for wine tasting

and production, it's mountainside lo-
cation is perfect for seeing natural
Turkey and all through the village are
shops where you can put your wine
tasting skills to the test.


Sirince was formed when people were
fleeing Ephesus. They settled in the
mountains and named the village
Cirkince which translated into ugly.
The reasoning for this was to keep out-
siders from getting curious and com-
ing into the village.

Day 7: Kusadasi (Breakfast, Lunch, Dinner)

After Breakfast we embark on the tour of Ephesus. Ephesus, once the most important commercial centre of the western Anatolia, is one of the highlights of Turkey that awaits the exploring tourists. The city was established as a port on the mouth of the river Cayster and was one of the foremost cities of the world for its being on a strategic trade route in Anatolia. The

city itself and the ruins are all on the sides of a fertile valley. The extensive ruins including the theatre, library or gymnasium create the special atmosphere of Ephesus, and appeal to every visitor.

Upon completion of the tour we shall enjoy a grand Indian lunch. After lunch we shall be visiting leather factory and local market in Kusadasi

Day 08: Kusadasi – Istanbul (Breakfast, Lunch, Dinner)

Breakfast and then transfer to Izmir airport for your flight to Istanbul.

Arrive Istanbul have lunch and check in to the hotel.

Istanbul - The Former capital of three successive empires, Roman, Byzantine and Ottoman. Istanbul today honours' and preserves the legacy of the past while looking forward to a modern Future. Istanbul of the

day conforms the definition of a great city, not only with her population and the area she covers but also with the variety of cultures and ways of living.

Later in the Evening enjoy a cruise on the Bosphorus and visit to spice bazaar. From the deck of our cruise boat take in the sights and sounds of this legendary waterway that is lined with historic villages, grand wooden mansions, imposing fortresses, like AnadoluHisari and the Baroque palaces of the late Ottoman sultans.





Day 09: Istanbul (Breakfast, Lunch, Dinner)

This morning wake up to the scrumptious breakfast prepared by our very own Maharaj and set off for a full day sightseeing of Istanbul.

We shall today visit the Blue Mosque: “Istanbul’s imperial Mosque of Sultan Ahmet I (Sultan Ahmet Camii) is called the Blue Mosque because of its interior tiles, mostly on the upper level and difficult to see unless you’re right up there with them. Forget the blue tiles! The mosque (built 1603-17) is the masterpiece of Ottoman architect Sedefkâr Mehmet Aga. It’s built on the site of the Great Palace of Byzantium, on the southeastern side of the Hippodrome” and Hippodrome; “The Hippodrome of Constantinople was a horse-racing track that was the sporting and social centre of Constantinople, capital of the Byzantine Empire and the largest city in Europe. Today it is a square named Sultanahmet in the Turkish city of Is-

tanbul, with only a few fragments of the original structure surviving.

Later visit Topkapi Palace: The first buildings of the Topkapı Palace, the primary and official residence of Ottoman sultans, were constructed after the conquest of İstanbul in 1453, between 1460 and 1478, by order of Sultan Mehmed II the Conqueror (Fatih Sultan Mehmet). The palace was built on the site of the acropolis of the ancient city of Byzantium located on the Seraglio Point (Sarayburnu), at the end of the historic peninsula of İstanbul between the Sea of Marmara, the Bosphorus and the Golden Horn.

The Grand Bazaar in Istanbul is one of the largest and oldest covered markets in the world, with 61 covered streets and over 4,000 shops on a total area of 30,700 m², attracting between 250,000 and 400,000 visitors daily.

Day 10 : Istanbul (Breakfast, Lunch, Dinner)

Today enjoy a full day picnic at the beautiful Prince's Islands.

Istanbul's Princes' Islands are havens of tranquility and the ultimate escape from Istanbul's noise and traffic without having to fly or drive long distances.

Dotted with impressive wooden country mansions, and full of fragrant tangerine and lemon trees, wisterias, pink magnolias, and yellow daffodils, Istanbul's Princes' Islands, while only a few kilometers from the city's Asian shores, feel like a world away.

The nine-island archipelago, called Kızıl Adalar (Red Islands) or simply Adalar (Islands) in Turkish, is also referred to as the Princes' Islands, owing

it to Byzantine era's exiled princes and princesses. Throughout history, the islands have welcomed aristocracy, exiled politicians, authors, artists, and minorities, all of whom left their traces on the archipelago.

Take a ferry to the island of Büyükada which is the largest island and the most popular with tourists. Whether it is the historic pier, big market square, famous restaurants, spectacular summer mansions lining Çankaya street, or the AyaYorgi monastery overlooking the blue sea, Büyükada welcomes visitors with its history and beauty.

Return back to Istanbul by ferry.

Later in the evening visit Taksim Square.

Cancellation Policy


- Non-refundable deposit amount of Rs. 50,000
